Subject: Request for continuing the registration of LLB pass out students from three centres of Faculty of Law, Delhi University

Dear Sirs,

I was in receipt of your letter No. BCI: D: 1442:2014(LE/Afflin.) dated 3.9.2012 which was actually sent on 3.9.2014. I am again in receipt of your letter No. BCI:D:1541(LE/Afflin.) dated 22.9.2014 which is sent on 22.9.2014.

I and my colleague Incharges in the three law centres are shocked to receive the revision letter dated 22.9.2014 in which you have sought to revise the drastic steps taken against this world renowned University from 2014-15 to 2013-14 pleading under a simple statement of typographical error. This has serious consequences for large number of students roughly 1600 and in relation to this premier University and enviable Faculty of Law in its contribution to Legal Education.

Please note that I as a Head & Dean, Faculty of Law and my superior officers PVC and VC are seized of the matter and are contemplating all steps suggested by you including application for affiliation before 31st December, 2014.

Kindly appreciate that this Faculty of Law exists from 1924 i.e. from 90 years and all these three centres namely Law Centre-I and Law Centre II exist from 1971 and CLC exists from 1975, all these Centres work under Head and Dean Faculty of Law, Delhi University through their respective Professor Incharges.

You would appreciate that this faculty employs full time teachers and Associate Professors and Professors to the extent of 150 and has about 20 guest faculties. All of them are in compliance with various NET qualifications. The attendance record of all the three centres is very steadfastly maintained. This year we have also removed the discrepancy of 66 percent/70 percent and raised the bar to 70% attendance.

It is also on record that the teaching faculties and course contents at DU are best. The classes take place regularly. DU is one of the few Universities where full pay scales are paid to all full time teachers and Guest Faculties. The BCI has prescribed 30 courses four years back. Delhi University teaches 30 courses from 1968 when all other universities taught 18 courses. Even now in 2014 DU has adopted teaching of 34 courses in six semesters including all compulsory and many optional courses.
