

You are also aware that the High Court monitors the attendance of this faculty of law and its centers and no relaxation is given to any candidate. We detain about 150 students against all social pressures and calls from influential persons of the country.

The Examinations are held promptly and appropriately under the effective control of Controller of Examinations, University of Delhi. This University is famous for its good credentials and there is no manipulation found in holding classes, which are completely regular and maintenance of libraries is excellent.

I request you to consider the academic contribution of this Faculty of Law from 1924 and its three centres and see that we in one institution which various executive members to Bar Council of various states and about present 80 High Court Judges in all the states and large number of advocates and judges in lower judiciary. A lot of respect to the legal profession in all its facets of legislature, advocates, and courts comes from the three centres of this Faculty of Law. Various Professors of this University have been manning VC positions and Judicial Academies. Various Universities are inspected by the Professors of this faculty and there is maintained high standards of legal education.

I assure you that we are taking all steps to apply for the extension of affiliation as decided by the Bar Council of India in recent past when 2008 Rules and Resolution No 53 of 2012 have been adopted. It is also true that no inspection in all these three centres has ever taken place and the prescription of inspection is recent.

I assume that this letter must have been sent to three centres as you say, but the Bar Council of India knows the whole structure of the Delhi University and it would have been advisable to send the letter to Vice-Chancellor as it has been done now, but more appropriately the Head of the Department and Dean Faculty of Law is designated officer to oversee the development of all the three centres working under him through three Professor Incharges.

While I wish to accept the reformation steps of legal education, simultaneously, I would request you in keep in mind the high standards and contribution of this faculty of Law through its three centres. I also state that because of the prescription of additional 54% seats by the Govt. of India to comply with OBC expansion, 3% seats for Physically Handicapped, and three percent seats for dependent of Armed Forces, we also feel some pressure on certain facilities.


I assure you that we will take up all the remedial measures and we will fully cooperate with the Bar Council of India in upkeeping the standards of legal education. I would also add that you should use more experts and teachers in various activities in Bar Council of India.

I by this letter request you to revise the advice to State Bar Councils and withdraw the non-eligibility directive for enrolment as an Advocate from 2013-14 urgently and continue with registration as advocate all the pass out LL.B students from DU. I assure you that we will come back to you for affiliation and inspection in near future,

Kindly treat this matter as most urgent, important and oblige by permitting our students to enrol as advocates.
