APPEAL TO THE STUDENTS OF HNLU

Through my second appeal dated 30.09.2018, I sincerely advised you to call off your protest and resume your classes from Monday onwards i.e. 01.10.2018 but I have come to know that instead of accepting my abovesaid advice, you have rather intensified your protest and converted the same into hunger strike.

I have replied to all the points raised by you in support of your No Confidence Motion against me and I am always ready and willing to do the best in the interest of the students and the University as per the Act, Statute, Rules and Regulations. I am still ready to have a fruitful dialogue with you so as to come to a viable, ethical and lawful solution. It is quite unfortunate that despite my best efforts to make you understand that to demand resignation from any person who has been duly appointed is neither moral nor legal. Moreover, to entertain and fulfill such demands is to set an unhealthy tradition and it is in no way in the interest of the development and growth of any institution. Today, you are asking for the resignation of the Vice Chancellor for the hidden reasons best known to those who are leading and who are behind this protest/hunger strike. Tomorrow, you will ask for the resignation of any of the teachers/non-teaching employees who does not act according to your taste. So, there is no end to it. If this state of affairs is allowed to continue, it will cause frustration among all those who work with dedication towards the fulfillment of the pious objectives of the University and not to satisfy unjust demands of certain individuals.

In view of it, I wish, you all to ask your conscience whether your demand is just, fair and reasonable by any stretch of imagination and how it is going to benefit you in true sense. You all are students of law and are expected to behave in accordance with the principles of law and justice.

Therefore, I once again appeal to you to immediately call off your unwarranted protest/hunger strike and resume your classes etc. so as to avoid any step/action which the University may be compelled to take in order to restore normalcy in the University.
