**Subject: Non Implementation of Rule of Reservation with respect to OBC/BC Category in admission of National Law University/Schools-Reg.**

Complaints have been received against the National Law Universities/Schools (NLUs) stating that there are irregularities in the process of admission and thereby these NLUs are deliberately violating the rules, G.Os, provisions of Constitution and not providing any reservations (in admissions for LL.B & LL.M courses) to the Socially & Educationally Backward Communities.

2. The Commission after reviewing the Petitioner's contentions/ documents decided to seek reply/comments of the Chairman, University Grants Commission, Chief Secretaries of concerned States, Commissioners of BC Welfare Departments and Vice Chancellors of NLUs through letter No. NCBC/MEMBER-AT/D.O. FILENo. 05/2019 dated 28.11.2019 and asked to appear in person on 17.12.2019 at NCBC Hq. New Delhi (all NLUs) which was later postponed and fixed to 20.01.2020 (for five states of Himachal Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Punjab, Rajasthan and Telangana).

After detailed discussion with respondents and petitioners, the Commission observed that;

1. The petitioner stated that under the prevailing law, “in *Indian higher education institutions, 15% and 7.5% seats are reserved for SCs and STs Category candidates, respectively. Apart from that, 27% seats are reserved by the government for OBC category students.* However, these NLUs are not providing any such reservations for OBC category in their admission process for higher education.
2. It was informed that National Law Universities and State Government Universities which were established under Statutes enacted by the State Legislatures and also receives grants-in-aid from the University Grants Commission and State Governments. The Statute provides two types of seats in their admissions. One for their local domicile candidates and rest for the “all India” seats. In these total seats, most of the universities are not providing any OBC reservation in admissions neither in local domicile seats nor in all India seats. And few of the universities are providing OBC reservation only in the local domicile percentage of seats and not in the all India seats. This shows that these universities are not following the rule of reservations for OBC in their admissions in their total seats, which is a major concern.
3. Coming to OBC reservations, presently 27% of reservation was recommended by Government owing to the legal constraint that the total quantum of reservation should not exceed 50 percent. States that have already introduced reservation for OBC exceeding 27% will not be affected by this recommendation.
4. The Hon’ble Supreme Court of India on 10 April 2008 upheld the Government's initiative of 27% OBC quotas in government-funded institutions.
5. Currently in most of the Indian Higher Education Institutions (established by Governments), 15% and 7.5% seats are reserved for SC and ST category candidates, respectively. Apart from that, 27% seats are reserved by the government for OBC category students. It says that a total percentage of reservation in Indian Colleges and Universities is up to 49.5%, leaving 50.5% seats available for General category candidates.
6. The “University Grants Commission” through their letter No. F-1-5/2006(SCT) dated 25th August 2006 and through Letter F. No. 59-6/2012(CU) dated 03rd June 2016 has circulated the “Central Educational Institutions (Reservation and Admission) Act, 2006

(Gazette Notification dated 04-01-2007) and as amended in 2012 (Gazette Notification dated 20-06-2012), called for strict adherence to the Central Reservation Policy in all the Central Universities, State Universities, Deemed to be Universities and Others **(Annexure-I)**.

7. Now, it is a concern that these National Law Schools (State Universities) established under the State Acts are neither following the Backward Class reservation of Central Government nor their State Government reservation policy in their admissions. That such top class Universities of Law in various states are not implementing the Backward Class Reservation at the time of admissions, whereby the BC Community at large are losing the opportunities provided to them through various Laws.
8. These Universities have violated the Article 15(4) & Article 29(2) in The Constitution of India by not implementing the rule of reservation with respect to the BC / OBC Category for the admissions.
9. "UGC Regulation, 1985 Regarding the Minimum standards of instruction for the grant of the First Degree through formal education" issued by UGC, New Delhi dated 25-11-1985.

As per this documents the conditions stipulated for the universities to be recognized by UGC is to strict adherence to the reservation orders issued by the government from time to time,

*"No student shall be eligible for admission to the 1<sup>st</sup> Degree Course in these faculties unless he had successfully completed 12years schooling through an examination conducted by a Board/University. The admission shall be made on merit on the basis of criteria notified by the institutions after taking into account the reservation order issued by the government from time to time."*

These NLUs have failed to implement the "UGC Regulation, 1985 **(Annexure-II)**.

10. The Vice Chancellors stated that it is completely a governed and functioning body under their respective Acts, Rules and Regulations and no other law is applicable to the University. This argument of the Vice-Chancellors is not correct. It must be noted that Constitution of India is supreme in this country and any law must abide by the provisions of Constitution. When the present OBC reservations flow from the Constitution, such provisions has the highest prominence over any other statutes, laws or regulations.
11. It is much surprising that when these NLUs statutes has no provision to admit the Foreign National Students in particular, however NLUs have reserved specific 15 seats for foreign nationals and denied admissions of Indian Nationals to provide reservations to BC Category Students at local level and OBC at National Level.
12. The Vice Chancellors apprised the Commission that the matter of the BC reservation was raised before the Hon'ble High Court of Judicature of Andhra Pradesh in the writ appeal no. 832 of 2009, A two judge bench of the High Court held that *"We are of the view that unless Government makes any special provision for reservations to BCs, the Universities cannot be directed to provide the same.* However, the Petitioner apprised the commission that after this order dated 26-06-2009 of the Hon'ble High Court, the State Government of

Telangana has issued G.O.Ms.3 of 2014 to implement 29% reservation for Backward Class in all Higher Education institutions which includes NALSAR UNIVERSITY OF LAW as it is established under the State (**Annexure-III**). Like wise every state has already issued their orders for implementation of OBC reservation in Higher Education institutes.

13. It is objectionable that being in the capacity of Vice Chancellor giving false information to this Commission that NALSAR is not receiving any funds from UGC, Central or State Governments and running on self-funding. The documents submitted by the Petitioner shows that NALSAR is receiving an amount of 3.5 to 4 Crores every year and further member present from UGC also states that NALSAR is receiving funds from the UGC itself. These statements show that the few universities like NALSAR are behaving like private universities established only for monetary benefits.
14. The UGC representatives present stated that they have issued all required necessary orders, letters and intimations time-to-time to implement the OBC reservations in these colleges. But, these NLUs are ignoring their orders and whenever sought any report, they were giving vague replies.
15. The statements of both UGC and State Government representatives about these universities raises a concern over the basic functioning of these NLUs. The wrong statement given by the NALSAR university Vice-Chancellor stating in writing that no public funding is received by them, raises much alarm and concern over the basic quality of the education provided by them.
16. These NLUs are branded as top notch colleges in the country, and providing legal education towards nurturing and raising quality lawyers who will be useful to this nation. If such National Law Universities are not obeying the orders of UGC, state governments and constitutional provisions, here question raises as to what signal these NLUs are sending to the other educational universities and institutions in this country.
17. The State Government representatives and Backward Classes Welfare Departments representatives present stated that they have been rigorously following up this matter and have several times appraised these NLUs to implement OBC reservations in their admissions. The officers present assured this Commission that they will take all immediate necessary steps for effective implementation of the OBC reservations in these NLUs.
18. Few other Vice Chancellors stated that if there is any recommendation from the National Commission for Backward Classes / State Government, the Universities are all set to discuss this matter in their Governing Council / Executive Council to implement backward class as soon as possible.
19. Now, this Commission feels that it is high time that these NLUs have to set right their admission process. We have the UGC which is the recognising body, present before us and state government representatives are also present before us. This Commission is empowered under Article 338B of the Constitution of India to monitor and safeguard the rights of the socially and educationally backward classes as per various provisions as above.

20. Accordingly, the Commission recommends that the University Grants Commission to immediately take note of this serious irregularity in the admission process and monitor the admission process of the National Law Universities in all courses including LL.B & LL.M to be filled as per the UGC Act, other Acts, Rules and Regulations issued by Central Government or State Government time-to-time and strictly monitor to see the admission of OBC candidates of 27% in “all India seats” and “relevant percentage” recommended by State Governments in the local domicile seats for the admission of academic year starting 2020 onwards, and submit a compliance report at the earliest to this Commission. Also recommends to take stringent action against such Universities who do not want to follow the orders of UGC and have blatantly violated the rule of reservation for OBC in the admissions until academic year 2019.
21. The Commission recommends that all the National Law Universities to strictly implement the UGC guidelines, Central Educational Institutions Reservation Rules, State Government Rules and orders by following the admission of OBC candidates of 27% in “all India seats” and “relevant percentage” recommended by State Governments in the local domicile seats for the admission of academic year starting 2020 onwards, and submit a compliance report at the earliest to this Commission.

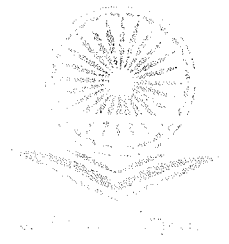

Subject: Implementation of Reservation Policy in admission and appointment.

Sir,

In continuation to this office letter No.F.21-2/2015 (CU) dated 23.03.2016 (copy enclosed) regarding the policy of reservation in admissions and appointments, I am directed to inform you to implement the reservation policy in admissions and appointments as under :-

- (i) University may follow the reservation policy in admissions in all courses as per provisions contained in the Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2006 (Gazette notification dated 04.01.2007) and as amended in 2012 (Gazette notification dated 20.06.2012). A copy of each of the CEI Act 2006 and Amendment Act, 2012 is enclosed for ready reference.
- (ii) For reservation policy in appointments of Non-Teaching staff, university may follow the quantum of reservation in Group 'C' and erstwhile Group 'D' posts as per Instructions issued by DoPT Order No.36011/6/2010-Estt.(Res.) dated 25<sup>th</sup> June, 2010 (copy enclosed). For reservation in Group 'A' and Group 'B' posts, the reservation for SC is 15%, for ST is 7.5% and for OBC, reservation in direct recruitment is 27%.
- (iii) In teaching positions, reservation for SC is 15% and for ST is 7.5% at all three levels i.e. Professor, Associate Professor and Assistant Professor. However, 27% OBC reservation in teaching positions is applicable at the level of Assistant Professor only.

*Subject: Revised Budget Estimates for 2015-2016 under Non-Plan of Central Universities -- regarding point wise reservation roaster.*

This is in reference to the discussion on Revised Budget Estimates for 2015-2016 held on 1<sup>st</sup> March, 2016 to 3<sup>rd</sup> March, 2016 in the UGC office. In this regard, I am directed to inform you that it has been observed that some of the Central Universities has not maintained the point wise reservation roaster. Therefore, it is to inform you to frame the point wise reservation roaster as per rules framed by the Govt. of India. Further, it is also to inform you that as per instructions of Govt. of India/UGC, the educational institutions receiving grant-in-aid from Central Government have to follow the *prescribed percentage of Reservation i.e. 15% for SCs, 7½% for STs and 27% in OBCs in the matter of teaching and non-teaching posts as well as in admissions to various courses except Minority educational institutions under Article 30(1) of the Constitution.* The Central Universities are receiving 100% grant from the Central Government/UGC and they have to follow the Reservation Policy of the Government of India for SCs/STs in toto i.e. 15% for SCs, 7½% for STs and 27% for OBCs in the matter of teaching and non-teaching posts as well as in admissions to various courses/degrees.

As per instructions of UGC, all the Central Universities have to maintain/provide the reservation for SCs/STs in teaching positions at all levels i.e. Assistant Professor, Associate Professor and Professor and OBC reservation at Assistant Professor only.

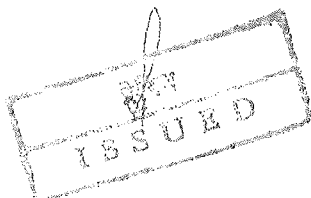

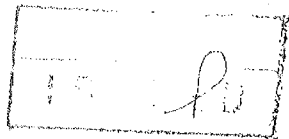

The following Act of Parliament received the assent of the President on the 3rd January, 2007, and is hereby published for general information:—

### THE CENTRAL EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS (RESERVATION IN ADMISSION) ACT, 2006 No. 5 of 2007

[3rd January, 2007.]

An Act to provide for the reservation in admission of the students belonging to the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Other Backward Classes of citizens, to certain Central Educational Institutions established, maintained or aided by the Central Government, and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

Enacted by Parliament in the Fifty-seventh Year of the Republic of India as follows:—

1. This Act may be called the Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2006.

2. It shall extend to the whole of India except Jammu and Kashmir.

3. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires, (a) "Central Educational Institution" means an institution of higher learning established, maintained or aided by the Central Government, and (b) "Other Backward Classes" means the classes of citizens as notified by the Government of India.

"Annual permitted strength" means the number of seats in a branch of study or faculty or teaching or instruction in each branch of study or faculty or teaching or instruction, as determined by the appropriate authority for admission of students in a Central Educational Institution;

(c) "appropriate authority" means the University Grants Commission, the Council of India, the Medical Council of India, the All India Council for Technical Education or any other authority or body established by or under a Central Act for the determination, coordination or maintenance of the standards of higher education in any Central Educational Institution;

(d) "Central Educational Institution" means—

- (i) a university established or incorporated by or under a Central Act;
- (ii) an institution of national importance set up by an Act of Parliament;
- (iii) an institution, declared as a deemed University under section 3 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956, and maintained by or receiving aid from the Central Government;
- (iv) an institution maintained by or receiving aid from the Central Government, whether directly or indirectly, and affiliated to an institution referred to in clause (i) or clause (ii), or a constituent unit of an institution referred to in clause (iii);
- (v) an educational institution set up by the Central Government under the Societies Registration Act, 1860;

(e) "faculty" means the faculty of a Central Educational Institution;

(f) "Minority Educational Institution" means an institution established and administered by the minorities under clause (1) of article 30 of the Constitution and so declared by an Act of Parliament or by the Central Government or declared as a Minority Educational Institution under the National Commission for Minority Educational Institutions Act, 2004;

(g) "Other Backward Classes" means the class or classes of citizens who are socially and educationally backward, and are so determined by the Central Government;

(h) "Scheduled Castes" means the Scheduled Castes notified under article 341 of the Constitution;

(i) "Scheduled Tribes" means the Scheduled Tribes notified under article 342 of the Constitution;

(j) "teaching or instruction in any branch of study" means teaching or instruction in a branch of study leading to three principal levels of qualifications at bachelor (undergraduate) masters (postgraduate) and doctoral levels.

Reservation of  
seats in Central

3. The reservation of seats in admission and its extent in a Central Educational Institution shall be provided in the following manner, namely:—

- (i) out of the annual permitted strength in each branch of study or faculty, fifteen per cent. seats shall be reserved for the Scheduled Castes;

Central Educational Institutions (Reservation of Seats) Bill

1. The Central Government may, by notification, specify any institution or institutions which shall be deemed to be Central Educational Institutions for the purposes of this Act.

2. The annual permitted strength in any branch of study or faculty of any Central Educational Institution shall be determined for the academic session following the commencement of this Act.

3. The provisions of section 1 of this Act shall not apply to—

(a) any Central Educational Institution established in the period between the commencement of this Act and the commencement of the Constitution;

(b) the institutions of excellence, research institutions, institutions of national importance specified in the Schedule to this Act;

4. It is provided that the Central Government may, as and when considered necessary, by notification in the Official Gazette, amend the Schedule;

(a) a minority educational institution as defined in this Act;

(b) a course or programme at high levels of specialisation, including at the post-graduate level, within any branch of study or faculty, which the Central Government may, in consultation with the appropriate authority, specify.

5. (1) Inwithstanding anything contained in clause (iii) of section 3 and in any other law for the time being in force, every Central Educational Institution shall, with the prior approval of the appropriate authority, increase the number of seats in a branch of study or faculty over and above its annual permitted strength so that the number of seats, including those reserved for the persons belonging to the Scheduled Caste, the Scheduled Tribes and the Other Backward Classes, is not less than the number of such seats available for the academic session immediately preceding the date of the coming into force of this Act.

Mandatory increase of seats.

(2) Where, on a representation by any Central Educational Institution, the Central Government, in consultation with the appropriate authority, is satisfied that for reasons of financial, physical or academic limitations or in order to maintain the standards of education, the annual permitted strength in any branch of study or faculty of such institution cannot be increased for the academic session following the commencement of this Act, it may permit by notification in the Official Gazette, such institution to increase the annual permitted strength over a maximum period of three years beginning with the academic session following the commencement of this Act, and then, the extent of reservation for the Other Backward Classes as provided in clause (iii) of section 3, shall be limited for that academic session in such manner that the number of seats available to the Other Backward Classes for each academic session are commensurate with the increase in the permitted strength for each year.

6. The Central Educational Institutions shall take all necessary steps, which are required in giving effect to the provisions of sections 3, 4 and 5 of this Act, for the purposes of reservation of seats in admissions to its academic sessions commencing on and from the calendar year, 2002.

Reservation of seats in admissions to begin in calendar year, 2002.

7. Any notification made under this Act shall be laid, as soon as may be after it is made, before each House of Parliament while it is in session, for a total period of thirty days which may be comprised in one session or in two or more successive sessions, and if, in any House, the resolution is passed annulling the notification, or if, in both Houses, the resolution is passed annulling the notification, the notification shall be deemed to be annulled. If the notification is not annulled, it shall be deemed to be in force, as the case may be, and, however, that any notification made under this Act shall be without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to be done in pursuance of the notification.

An Act to amend the Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2006

Enacted by Parliament in the Sixty-third Year of the Republic of India as follows:—

1. This Act may be called the Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Amendment Act 2012. Short title.

2. In section 2 of the Central Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2006 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act), after clause (i), the following clauses shall be inserted, namely:— Amendment of section 2.

(a) "specified north-eastern region" means the area comprising of the States of Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Sikkim, Tripura and the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir consequent to the Constitution;

(b) "state quota", in relation to a Central Educational Institution, means such quota, out of the annual permitted strength in each branch of study or faculty as

are earmarked to be filled from amongst the eligible students of the State in which such institution is situated;

of section 4.

3. In section 5 of the principal Act, the following provisos shall be inserted, namely:—

"Provided that the State seats, if any, in a Central Educational Institution situated in the tribal areas referred to in the Sixth Schedule to the Constitution shall be governed by such reservation policy for the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Other Backward Classes, as may be specified, by notification in the Official Gazette, by the Government of the State where such institution is situated;

Provided further that if there are no State seats in a Central Educational Institution and the seats reserved for the Scheduled Castes exceed the percentage specified under clause (i) or the seats reserved for the Scheduled Tribes exceed the percentage specified under clause (ii) or the seats reserved for the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes taken together exceed the sum of percentages specified under clauses (i) and (ii), but such seats are—

(a) less than fifty per cent. of the annual permitted strength on the date immediately preceding the date of commencement of this Act, the total percentage of the seats required to be reserved for the Other Backward Classes under clause (iii) shall be restricted to the extent such sum of percentages specified under clauses (i) and (ii) falls short of fifty per cent. of the annual permitted strength;

(b) more than fifty per cent. of the annual permitted strength on the date immediately preceding the date of commencement of this Act, in that case no seat shall be reserved for the Other Backward Classes under clause (iii) but the extent of the reservation of seats for the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes shall not be reduced in respect of Central Educational Institutions in the specified north-eastern region."

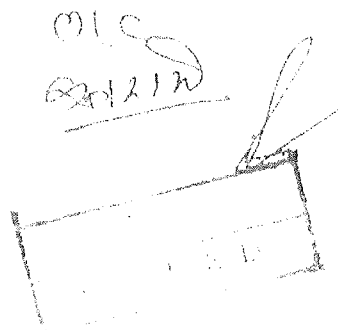

## UNIVERSITY GRANTS COMMISSION

### UGC GUIDELINES FOR STRICT IMPLEMENTATION OF RESERVATION POLICY OF THE GOVERNMENT IN UNIVERSITIES, DEEMED TO BE UNIVERSITIES, COLLEGES AND OTHER GRANT-IN-AID INSTITUTIONS AND CENTERS.

1. Central Government has been issuing various instructions from time to time for implementing the Reservation Policy of the Government, and UGC, being an autonomous statutory body, under the administrative control of the Ministry of Human Resource Development, is under directions from the Government to strictly implement the said instructions by all grant-in-aid institutions.

2. Central Government, Ministry of Human Resource Development (Dept. of Secondary & Higher Education), vide their Order No. F.No.6-30/2005 U-5 dated 6<sup>th</sup> December, 2005 issued the following directions to the University Grants Commission:-

WHEREAS Article 46 of the Constitution states that, "The State shall promote, with special care, the education and economic interests of the weaker sections of the people, and, in particular of the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, and shall protect them from social injustice and all forms of social exploitation.

AND WHEREAS, the policy of the Central Government is that in the Central Universities and institutions which are Deemed to be Universities receiving grants-in-aid from the public exchequer, the percentage of reservation in admissions and recruitments in teaching and non-teaching posts is to be 15% for Scheduled Castes and 7.5% for Scheduled Tribes.

AND WHEREAS, the University Grants Commission, New Delhi hereinafter referred to as UGC, is a statutory autonomous organization responsible for implementation of policy of the Central Government in the matter of admissions as well as recruitment to the teaching and non-teaching posts in the Central Universities and institutions which are Deemed to be Universities;

And WHEREAS, the UGC has failed to ensure effective implementation of the reservation policy in the Central Universities and grantee institutions which are deemed to be Universities.

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers vested under Section 20(1) of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 the Government hereby directs the UGC to ensure effective implementation of the reservation policy in the Central Universities and those of institutions Deemed to be Universities receiving aid from the public funds except in minority institutions under Article 30(1) of the Constitution.

#### 4. Coverage and Applicability:

- (a) Reservation is applicable to all teaching posts such as the posts of Lecturers, Readers, Professors, or by whatever other nomenclature the posts are known, and to all posts of non-teaching staff of all the Universities, Deemed to be Universities, Colleges, and other grant-in-aid or research Institutions and Centers;
- (b) Reservation is also applicable to all admissions to Undergraduate, Postgraduate, M.Phil and Ph.D. courses of educational Institutions referred to in clause (a) above;
- (c) In the cases of reservations referred to in clause (a) above, the instructions issued by the Central Government for grouping of posts shall be resorted to wherever applicable, especially when more than one University functions under a single Act, or several colleges function under one University; grouping of posts are mandatory if the posts concerned are transferable on an inter-university or inter-college levels. The practice of creating department-wise cadres, which tends to create single posts or cadres with artificially reduced number of posts in order to avoid reservation, is strictly forbidden;
- (d) In the cases of reservations referred to in clause (b) above, the instructions issued by the Central Government with regard to reservation for implementing Article 16 (4) of the Constitution of India are strictly applicable to all central or any other special quota, permitted under any existing rules all the educational Institutions referred to in clause (a) above, shall also apply to admissions of candidates to those Institutions;
- (e) Relaxation & concession in respect of educational qualification, age, experience and qualifying marks/standard etc. will be as per existing government rules in all cases of admissions, recruitments, appointments, promotions and other assignments or engagements to the members of SC/ST.

#### 5. Extent of Reservation:

- (a) In all the educational Institutions referred to in clause 4 (a) above, the extent of reservation applicable is 15% for SC and 7.5% for ST;
- (b) Without prejudice to the provisions contained in the clause (a) above, in all the educational Institutions referred to in clause (a) above, and functioning within any State shall follow the percentage of reservation prescribed by the respective State Government.

(a) No reservation in percentage is applicable when filling up of back-log/short fall vacancies of SC/ST.

Procedure to be followed in matters of reservation for teaching as well as non-teaching staff.

(b) Without prejudice to any procedure prescribed under various instructions from the Central Government from time to time, the following guidelines are to be followed:

- (i) SC/ST candidates should be interviewed separately;
- (ii) One member of the interview Committee shall belong to the SC/ST community;
- (iii) All the SC/ST candidates selected according to their position in the combined general merit list shall not be counted for covering the prescribed percentage of reservation;
- (iv) Rules of reservation are applicable both for direct recruitment as well as for promotion. If in internal promotion in feeder cadre candidates are not available, in that situation such positions be declared open and advertised in order to fill up the posts and fulfill reservation;
- (v) The Roster, 40-point or 100-point as the case may be, shall be applied to the total number of posts in cadre only. (*R K Sabharwal v. State of Punjab*, (AIR 1995 SC 1371); cadre is cast indicated by seniority list governing the members with the same pay-scale;
- (vi) Total number of vacancies shall be calculated, and Roster as referred above shall be applied only excluding the back-log vacancies, if any;
- (vii) Percentage of reservation shall be applied separately for each recruitment year, and not whenever the vacancies arise, or interviews take place, or recruitment/appointment is made;

2 Procedure to be followed in matters of reservation for admission:

- (a) All the procedures prescribed under various instructions from the Central Government from time to time, as referred to in sub-clause (a) of clause 2 above, shall be applicable *mutatis mutandis* to matters of admission of students referred to in all the educational institutions referred to in clause 6(a) above.
- (b) In cases of admissions, sub-clauses (i) to (iii) of clause (a) above would only be applicable; and sub-clauses, (iv) to (vii) are not applicable;
- (c) In cases of admissions, the following procedures are also to be followed:
  - (i) No SC/ST student can seek admission or claim reservation, unless he/she appears in national or State/common or University/Institution tests held for the purpose, in order to avail the quota of seats reserved for them, by the educational Institutions referred to in sub-clause (a) of clause 6 above,
  - (ii) In cases, where National or Common/State or University/Institution test is not prescribed as necessary for selecting candidates for admission, the SC/ST candidates seeking admissions, shall be arranged in the order of merit among themselves, as per the merit position obtained in the qualifying examination;

of reservation for SC/ST for admission to postgraduate levels and research degrees;

- (iii) Percentage of reservation shall be applied separately for each academic year, and not whenever interviews take place, or recruitment is made;
- (iv) Rules of inter-casteability among SCs and STs are applicable, wherever necessary, to fill up the number of vacant seats;
- (v) In case no eligible reserved candidates are available, the vacant seats in the reserved quota shall not be filled by any non SC/ST candidates. Every effort shall be made to re-advertise for wider publicity in the leading national news papers;
- (vi) Advance special (short term) coaching with assistance from UGC may be introduced for prospective SC/ST students;
- (vii) In the Universities where central Registration for admission of SC/ST students has been introduced, all admission process must be completed at the central level itself, and the assigned Colleges, Institutes or Centers as the case may be only permitted to make attempts to fill in the vacant SC/ST seats, at their instance;
- (viii) All institutions referred to in sub-clause (a) of clause (6) should give the maximum possible encouragement and support to girls of SC/ST in admission.

v. **Annual Report:**

- (a) All the Institutions referred to in sub-clause (a) of clause 6 above shall submit reports about the implementation of these guidelines annually by 15<sup>th</sup> February of the following year in the prescribed format, attached to these Guidelines to the Deputy Secretary, SCT Division, University Grants Commission, New Delhi with a copy each to the Ministry of Human Resource Development or the Department of Education of the concerned State Government.
- (b) All applications for grant-in-aid, shall be accompanied by the reports on the implementation of these guidelines during the previous recruitment or academic year, as the case may be;
- (c) Reports as referred to in sub-clause (a) should assist UGC to re-adjust or reduce the extent of demand for grant-in-aid for the following academic year, at least in proportion to the deficiency in implementation of these guidelines during the previous recruitment/ academic year.
- (d) A separate chapter in the annual report published by the Institutions should be provided to explain the steps undertaken and the results accomplished for bringing the level of performance of SC/ST to general level during the year.

11 **Admission to Hostel Accommodations:**

The percentage of reservation referred above under the head 'percentage' shall be strictly observed for admission to the hostels. Additional percentage of seats may be provided for the girl students of those communities. No rent shall be charged from the students of these communities;

**SC/ST Quota:**

The percentage of reservation for Staff Quarters, transit Houses, dormitories and hostels shall be commensurate with the quantum of reservation as prescribed in paragraph 7 above.

**Liaison Officer:**

Each University/Institution shall appoint a Liaison Officer, who is a full-time staff member of the University of the concerned State or Central Government and will be responsible for monitoring and the implementation of reservation under these guidelines.

**14. SC/ST Cell:**

All the Universities/Institutions referred to in sub-clause (a) of paragraph 6 above shall establish an SC/ST Cell in order to process the grievances of the members of these communities. The SC/ST Cell shall function under the overall supervision of the Liaison Officer.

**15. Advisory Committees:**

Advisory Committees with Vice Chancellor/ Principal as Chairman be constituted to review the implementation of reservation policy in admission and capacity building programmes for SC/ST for their successful passing in examinations. The Committee should meet at least once in a quarter and action taken on decisions reviewed in the next meeting.

**16. Amendments to existing University Acts and Statutes:**

Action should be initiated by the Universities so as to effect necessary amendments to their Acts/Statutes for the statutory support for reservation in admission, appointments to teaching and non-teaching posts and representation of SC/ST in their bodies like Syndicate Executive Council, Academic Council, Selection Committees, etc.

**17. Miscellaneous:**

The above policy guidelines are minimum prescribed for observation of the reservation policy for SC/ST. The University/Institutions are free to provide additional benefits to these categories with the approval of their Board of Governors/Executive Councils etc.

**UGC Regulations, 1985 regarding the Minimum Standards of instructions  
for the Grant of the First Degree through Non-formal/Distance Education**

25th November 1985

No.F1117/83(CP) ?In exercise of the powers conferred by Clause (f) of subsection(1) of Section 26 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 (No. 3 of 1956), the University Grants Commission makes the following regulations, namely:-

1. *Short title, application and commencement:-*

1. These regulations may be called the University Grants Commission (the minimum standards of instructions for the grant of the first degree through nonformal/distance education in the faculties of Arts, Humanities, Fine Arts, Music, Social Sciences, Commerce and Sciences) Regulations, 1985.
2. They shall apply to every university established or incorporated by or under a Central Act, Provincial Act or of a Section 2 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 and every institution deemed to be University under Section 3 of the said Act.
3. They shall come into force on June 1, 1986.

2. *Admission/Students:*

1. No student shall be eligible for admission to the 1st Degree Course through nonformal/distance education unless he has successfully completed 12 years schooling through an examination conducted by a Board/University. In case there is no previous academic record, he shall be eligible for admission if he has passed an entrance test conducted by the University provided that he is not below the age of 21 years on July 1 of the year of admission.
2. No student shall be eligible for the award of the first degree unless he has successfully completed a three year course; this degree may be called the B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. (General Honours/Special) degree as the case may be.

Provided that no student shall be eligible to seek admission to the Master's Course in these faculties, who has not successfully pursued the first Degree Course of three years duration.

Provided further that, as a transitory measure where the universities are unable to



change over to a three year degree course, they may award a B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. (Pass) degree on successful completion of two year course, but that no student of this stream shall be eligible for admission to the Master's course unless he has undergone a further one year bridge course and passed the same. The three year degree course after 10+2 stage should in no case be termed as B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. (Pass) degree.

3. *Programme of study:*

1. Each lesson shall constitute approximately one week's reading and there shall be at least 25 lessons in each main subject of study. The lessons shall be despatched to the student at regular intervals.
2. The University shall set up study centres (outside the headquarters) in areas where there is a reasonable concentration of students. Each study centre shall have adequate library facilities (text books, reference materials and lessons and supporting materials). They shall also have qualified parttime instruction/counselling staff to advise and assist the students in the studies and remove individual difficulties.
3. A contact programme of 810 days shall be organised in different places where there is a reasonably good number of students, to include lectures and discussions in support of the studies. Classes may be arranged on Sundays and other holidays at the headquarters.
4. Adequate number of practicals shall be provided in all courses involving such work and if necessary, these may be arranged in the evening, during holidays or vacations in the existing institutions.
5. Every student at the undergraduate level shall be required to do at least five home assignments in each subject which shall be made available to him at regular intervals, received back, corrected, graded and returned to the student at regular intervals. The University shall maintain a record of the progress of studies of each student.
6. The minimum number of assignments performed by a student for each subject shall be 3 in order to be eligible for appearing in the examination in the concerned subject.

4. *Examination:*

1. The University shall adopt the guidelines issued by the University Grants Commission from time to time in regard to the conduct of examinations.
2. There shall be home assignments, students response sheets, contact programmes and semester/year end examination. The marks or grades obtained in home assignment and response sheets shall be shown separately in the grade card alongwith percentile ranking. Further more,

the University shall develop a dependable system of checks and controls on marks or grades awarded in home assignment and response sheets.

*Explanations:*

Percentile rank refers to the percentage of all the examinees in the course who had the same or higher percentage of marks or grade in the examination.

3. The examination question papers shall be framed so as to ensure that no part of the syllabus is left out of study by a student.
4. No Semester/Yearend examination shall be held in a subject unless the University is satisfied that at least 75% of the programme of study indicated under subregulations 3, and 3(4) have been actually conducted.

5. *Teachers:*

1. No teacher shall be appointed who does not fulfil the minimum qualification prescribed for recruitment as per University Grants Commission (Qualification required of a person to be appointed to the teaching staff of a University or other Institutions affiliated to it Regulations, 1982 notified under Section 26(i) (e) of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956.
2. Every teacher shall be available in the Institution on each working day during the period prescribed and shall perform such duties as specified under subregulations 5(4) and in addition undertake examination/test/evaluation/invigilation work, general assistance to students in removing their academic difficulties and participate in extracurricular and institutional support activities as required.
3. The work load of a teacher shall take into account teaching research and extension activities, preparation of lessons, evaluation of assignments, term papers etc. and shall be in accordance with the guidelines issued by the University Grants Commission from time to time for nonformal and distance education:

Provided that the time spent on extension work where it forms an integral part of the course prescribed shall count towards the teaching load.

4. The workload of a teacher in Distance Education course shall include the following:
  - i. Preparing, editing writing, revising translating lessons and other reading materials and checking the academic content thereof:

- ii. Teaching under personal contact programme as described in subregulation 3(3):
  - iii. Correction of student response sheets:
  - iv. Maintaining a record of work done by him termwise and submitting the same to the Institution:
  - v. Work during vacations to prepare reading materials, reading of proofs, etc.
  - vi. Such other work as may be assigned in connection with teaching or examination.
5. The norms of workload for teachers at the undergraduate level shall be as prescribed in the guidelines issued by the University Grants Commission from time to time.
6. The number of fulltime and parttime teachers shall be provided keeping in view:-
- i. Programme of study as provided in subregulations 3(1) 3(2) 3(3) 3(4) 3(5), and 3(6).
  - ii. total institutional work load as provided in sub regulations 5(1),5(2) 5(3) 5(4) and 5(5) and
  - iii. total enrolment of students.
6. *Information:*

Every University providing instruction through nonformal/ distance education shall furnish to the University Grants Commission information relating to the observance of these Regulations in the form prescribed for the purpose. The information shall be supplied to the University Grants Commission within 60 days of the close of the academic Year.

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**ORDER:**

In the reference first cited above, the erstwhile Government of Andhra Pradesh, based on the recommendations of the Anantharaman Commission for Backward Classes, had drawn up a list of (93) Backward Classes as amended thereafter (other than Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes) which are socially and educationally backward and classified them into four groups for the purpose of reservations in the professional colleges and in services under Articles 15 (4) and 16 (4) of the Constitution of India as detailed below:-

Group (A)	7%
Group (B)	10%
Group (C)	1%
Group (D)	7%

P.T.O

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2. Further, in the reference 6<sup>th</sup> read above, the erstwhile Government of Andhra Pradesh for the purpose of Articles 15 (4) and 16 (4) of the Constitution of India and in the exercise of the powers conferred under section 7 of the Andhra Pradesh Reservation in favour of Socially and Educationally Backward Classes of Muslims Act, 2007 (Act No. 26 of 2007), the (14) classes of Muslims residing in the united State of Andhra Pradesh (Other than Dudekula, Laddaf, Pinjari/Noorbash and Mehtar) as identified and recommended by the Andhra Pradesh Commission for Backward Classes, as socially and educationally Backward Classes of Muslims were included in the list of Backward Classes under separate Group "E", which is in addition to the existing "A", "B", "C" and "D" Groups and provided 4% reservation. However, the reservation in favour of Backward Classes Group "E" is subject to outcome of Civil Appeal Nos 2628-2637/2010 etc., pending before the Supreme Court.

3. Further, in the references 2<sup>nd</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> to 22<sup>nd</sup> cited, various other castes/communities were also included in the list of Backward Classes from time to time, on the recommendations of the Andhra Pradesh Commission for Backward Classes.

4. In view of the Andhra Pradesh Reorganisation Act, 2014 (Central Act.No.6, 2014), in the reference 24<sup>th</sup> read above, the Member Secretary, Andhra Pradesh Commission for Backward Classes has informed that as on 01.06.2014, there are (138) castes/communities in the list of Backward Classes as approved by the erstwhile Government of Andhra Pradesh from time to time in the undivided Andhra Pradesh State. After verification of the list and Government orders, it is found that (112) castes/communities of Backward Classes pertain to the State of Telangana and the Member-Secretary, AP Commission for Backward Classes has also enclosed the list of (112) castes/communities of Backward Classes pertaining to the State of Telangana along with the relevant Government orders.

5. In view of the Andhra Pradesh Reorganisation Act, 2014 (Central Act.No.6, 2014), Government of Telangana has decided to adapt all the relevant Government orders issued in the undivided State of Andhra Pradesh along with the list of (112) castes/communities which is annexed to this order, Group wise and Percentage of reservation as Backward Classes for the State of Telangana, so as to enable the respective Departments to take necessary action as per their requirements.

6. The Group wise list of (112) number of Castes/communities of Backward Classes, pertaining to the State of Telangana, with the percentage of reservation is as follows:-
