constitute a Search Committee comprising of the office bearers of the Supreme Court Bar Association for the purpose of facilitating the process of elevation by identifying and reserving meritorious Supreme Court lawyers.

Article 217, of the Constitution of India, provides for appointment and the conditions of the office of the Judges of the High Courts. In terms of the said Article, a person shall not be qualified for appointment as a Judge of the High Court, unless he has, for at least ten years, been an advocate of the High Court or of two or more such Courts in succession. This mandate of the Constitution, if read with the judgments of the Hon'ble Supreme Court relating to the appointment of the Judges while dealing with the Constitutional validity of the NJAC Act, upholding the Collegiums System for appointment of Judges, would leave no doubt that the focus and the primary consideration for appointment of members of the Bar, directly as Judges of the High Court, is to be considered from

amongst the members of the Bar who are actively practicing in the High Court. This becomes crystal clear, since the prerogative to appoint or recommend the appointment of Judges of the High Court is vested in the Hon'ble Chief Justice of the High Court after consultation with the senior-most Judges of the High Court who form part of the Collegium. Therefore, in what context and how there could be a possibility to appoint members of the Supreme Court Bar as Judges of the High Court although they are not practicing in that High Court, is something that one cannot comprehend under the present scheme of things, as laid down by the mandate of the Constitution and the judgments of the Hon'ble Supreme Court. Perhaps it is impermissible in law, as stated above, to make such appointments. This is something for the valuable consideration of your Lordship.

However, what is important to be noticed is that the Judges of the Hon'ble Supreme Court, are to be appointed

Article 124 (3) mandates that a person shall not be qualified for appointment as a Judge of the Hon'ble Supreme Court unless he has been, at least for ten years, an advocate of the High Court or two or more such Courts in succession. In view of this, the mandate of the Constitution and various judgments of the Hon'ble Supreme Court, members of the Bar practicing in various High Courts of the country are entitled to be considered for being elevated as Judges of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. This is a matter, which is perhaps, lost sight of by the Hon'ble Supreme Court so far. The various High Courts of the Country and I speak from my experience in the High Court of Karnataka, consists of highly distinguished lawyers practicing in the High Court. That apart from possessing requisite eligibility, they exemplary legal acumen, integrity and possess temperament to be elevated as Judges of the Hon'ble Supreme
