Amb. T.S. Tirumurti was in the Indian Foreign Service with a diplomatic career spanning 37 years between 1985-2022. He served as Ambassador/ Permanent Representative of India to the United Nations in New York between 2020-2022. He was President of the UN Security Council for August 2021 and also Chair of three Committees of the Security Council. Earlier, he was Secretary in the Ministry of External Affairs dealing with the Arab world, Africa, development partnership and economic relations.

Ambassador Tirumurti has previously served in Cairo, Geneva, Gaza, Washington D.C., Jakarta and was also India's High Commissioner to Malaysia. He was India's first Representative to the Palestinian Authority in Gaza. He served in various capacities in Ministry of External Afffairs, New Delhi including Head of the United Nations Division and Head of Division for four neighbouring countries - Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, Maldives and Myanmar. He was also a climate change negotiator for several years.

He is currently Distinguished Professor in Indian Institute of Technology Madras. He is in the Board of Governors of Dhirubhai Ambani University, Gandhinagar. He is the author of three books.

In addition to being a legal scholar, Dr. Dadhich has also worked as an advocate in the Supreme Court of India and has consulted on legal matters at Deloitte and EY, Gide Loyrette Nouel, Paris, White & Case, Brussels, and the Competition Commission of India.



International Trade Lawyer (Washington, DC) and Professor at Yale Law School Former International Trade Counsel of the U.S. Senate Finance Committee Former Head of Import Administration of the U.S. Department of Commerce

Mr. Horlick is the highest-ranked International Trade Lawyer in the world in two rankings, Euromoney/Institutional Investor and Who's Who Legal, and is in the top tier of Chambers (which does not list individual rankings). Mr. Horlick has worked in senior positions in the U.S. Congress (International Trade Counsel, U.S. Senate Finance Committee) and the Executive Branch (Head of Import Administration, U.S. Department of Commerce), where he was responsible for all U.S. antidumping and countervailing duty cases, foreign trade zones, special import programs, and the negotiation of the U.S.-EU Steel Agreement. He has been Chairman of WTO and Mercosur panels, and has litigated in U.S. courts and administrative agencies; GATT and WTO tribunals; NAFTA Chapters 19 and 20 tribunals; and anti-dumping cases in 12 countries. He has worked on issues involving climate change, textile quotas and monitoring, generalised system of preferences, non-market economy status, customs and tariff classification and valuation, export controls, CFIUS and investor-state disputes. Mr. Horlick has served as Counsel to businesses in the U.S. (IBM, Bowater, Arch Chemicals and others) and other countries (Pemex, Noranda, Barilla and others); the U.S. Government and other governments (UK, Canada, Mexico, Chile, South Africa and others); and trade associations. He has written numerous articles and delivered speeches on international trade and investment. He has served as first Chairman of the WTO Permanent Group of Experts on Subsidies; Chairman of the International Section of the DC Bar; Vice Chairman of the Trade Committee of the International Bar Association; and is a member of the Council of Foreign Relations. He teaches international trade law at Yale, Georgetown, and Berne Universities.

Dr. Zhao Hong, Professor of Law, faculty at the Law School of Peking University, a former Member (2016-2020) and Chairperson of the Appellate Body of the World Trade Organization (WTO). She held various senior positions at the PRC Ministry of Commerce (MOFCOM), including the Commissioner of the Department of WTO Affairs, Assistant Representative of the Office of Trade Negotiations, and Deputy Director-General of the Bureau of Anti-Monopoly. She chaired the WTO's TRIMS Committee when working at the China's Permanent Mission to the WTO as Minister Counsellor. After leaving MOFCOM, she served as a Deputy President of the China Academy of International Trade and Economic Cooperation. She was educated in Peking University Law School with LLB, LLM and PhD degrees. Currently, she is in the indicative list of panelists of WTO dispute settlement, an arbitrator at CIETAC, Shenzhen Court of International Arbitration and Shanghai Arbitration Commission. She is also an arbitrator on the panel of International Investment Dispute at Beijing Arbitration Commission. Her expertise is in areas of WTO law, international investment law, international trade law, competition and anti-monopoly, IPR and technology transfer and has profound interest in philosophy and history of law etc. Know More.

He also pioneered harmonization, sharing and trading of spectrum in the country. As Secretary, Department of Electronics & Information Technology (DeitY), Deepak led India's efforts in Internet Governance and anchored the Digital India Programme and facilitation of IT/ITeS sector. He served as a member of the Board of Indian Institute of Foreign Trade (IIFT), a trade focused business school, as well as India Trade Promotion Organization (ITPO). He was also Chairman & Managing Director of the State Trading Corporation of India from 2012 to 2013. He was India's Chief Negotiator at the WTO, for the RCEP agreement and the India-EU Free Trade Agreement and led trade negotiations in agriculture, manufactured products, services, rules, tariffs and subsidies and articulated the Indian position on e-commerce and investment. As Joint and Additional Secretary Commerce, Government of India (GOI), he dealt with trade policy, export promotion of electronics, pharmaceuticals, tea, coffee, spices, agriculture products and services.
