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I.A. 23387/2026 & I.A. 24665/2026 (Additional Documents)

1. The present applications have been filed on behalf of the petitioner under Order XI Rule 1(4) of the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as 'CPC') seeking leave to place on record additional documents.
2. The petitioner is permitted to file additional documents in accordance with the provisions of the Commercial Courts Act, 2015 ('CC Act') and the Delhi High Court (Original Side) Rules, 2018.

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3. Accordingly, the applications stand disposed of.

I.A. 23388/2026 (Seeking extension of time)

4. This is an application under Section 151 of CPC seeking extension of time to file certificate under Section 63(4)(c) of the Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam, 2023.

5. For the reasons stated therein, the same is allowed. The petitioner is granted three weeks time to file the required certificate as per Rules.

6. The application stands disposed of.

I.A. 23389/2026 (Exemption)

7. This is an application filed on behalf of the petitioner under Section 151 of CPC seeking exemption from filing clearer copies of documents along with the captioned suit.

8. Exemption allowed, subject to just exceptions. However, true typed/translated/clear copies of the documents with proper margins be filed within four weeks with an advance copy to the respondents.

9. The application stands disposed of.

I.A. 23390/2026 (Seeking extension of time)

10. This is an application filed on behalf of the petitioner under Section 151 of CPC seeking extension of time to file clearer copies of dim documents.

11. For the reasons stated therein, the same is allowed. However, two weeks time is granted to the petitioner to file clearer copies of the documents with an advance copy to the respondents.

12. The application stands disposed of.

I.A. 23391/2026(Seeking permission to file lengthy list of dates & synopsis)

13. This is an application filed on behalf of the petitioner under Section 151 of CPC seeking permission to file lengthy list of dates and synopsis.

14. For the reasons stated therein, the same is allowed. The lengthy list of dates and synopsis is taken on record.



15. The application stands disposed of.

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16. This is a petition under Section 9 of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996, seeking urgent interim directions as sought in the prayer clause, enumerated hereunder:

“a. Pass an interim measure of protection restraining Respondent No.1/JBCG and Respondent No.2/Centrum, their directors, officers, employees, agents, nominees and any person acting on their behalf or claiming through them, from undertaking, effecting, agreeing to effect, offering, soliciting, marketing, or in any manner giving effect to any Transfer of, and/or from creating, agreeing to create or permitting the creation of any Encumbrance over, any Warrants of Respondent No.3 (whether Series 1 Warrants or Series 2 Warrants), in favour of any person whatsoever, without the prior written consent of the Petitioner and in breach/violation of 12.1(b), 12.1(c), 12.4 and 20.8 of the Shareholders’ Agreement dated 26 October 2021;

b. Pass an interim measure of protection restraining Respondent No.3, its directors, officers, employees, agents and any person acting on its behalf, from registering, recording, entering in its record of Warrant Holders, giving effect to, acting upon, or instructing any RTA, depository to give effect to, any Transfer of, or Encumbrance over, any Warrants of Respondent No.3 effected without the prior written consent of the Petitioner and in breach of the SHA, and from approving any such Transfer or Encumbrance, whether by the Board, by any Committee of the Board, by delegated authority or otherwise;

c. Pass an interim measure of protection restraining Respondent No.3, its directors, officers, employees, agents and any person acting on its behalf, from acting upon, implementing or giving effect to the circular resolution of the Stakeholders Relationship Committee approved on 17 September 2025 in relation to the “Revision in process for Transfer of Securities of Unity Small Finance Bank Limited”, insofar as it relates to Warrants of Respondent No.3, and from approving any transfer of warrants pursuant to the delegation contained therein;

d. Direct the Respondents to furnish to the Petitioner, on affidavit and within such time as this Hon’ble Court may fix, complete particulars of all warrants of Respondent No.3, including (i) the identity of every holder of warrants as on date; (ii) the number and series of warrants held by each such holder; (iii) the date of each Transfer, the identity of the transferor and the transferee, and the consideration paid; (iv) the resolution, authority or delegation under which each such Transfer was approved; (v) the deed of adherence or deed of undertaking, if any, executed by each transferee under Clause 12.4 of the Shareholders’ Agreement; (vi) the fit and proper determination, if any, made in respect of each transferee; and (vii) complete particulars of every Encumbrance created over any warrants, including the identity of the chargeholder, the date of creation, the amount secured and the number and



series of warrants encumbered;

e. Pass ad-interim ex-parte reliefs in terms of prayers (a) to (e) hereinabove pending the hearing and final disposal of the present Petition; and

f. Pass any other order or direction that this Hon'ble Court may deem just, equitable and proper in the facts and circumstances of the present case."

17. Issue notice.

18. Notice accepted by Mr. Ashish Aggarwal, learned counsel appearing for the respondent, who are granted not more than two weeks to file the reply. Rejoinder thereto, if any, may be filed within three days thereafter.
